Village Improvements

Further improvements have taken place across the village this week. A new staggered gate has been installed on the Bowlers' Path, and we are hopeful this will also help address ongoing concerns regarding dog fouling in the area. Sandy and John have given the hutches a fresh coat of paint, making a significant difference to their appearance, while the team has planted the barrels at the Fulshie to add some much-needed colour. Thank you to Jean for her continued commitment in maintaining the larger planters within the village.



Fauldhouse Path Update

Update from West Lothian Council
Bottom Groundworks have started on site today (Fauldhouse side). The programme plan has work being completed in phases:

Phase 1 – Main Street to Bridge Street,
Fauldhouse – up to approx. 9 weeks

Phase 2 – Bridge Street to path adjacent
to Breichwater Place – up to approx. 8
weeks

Phase 3 – Path adjacent to Breichwater
place to A706 – up to approx. 7 weeks

They intend to finish each phase before moving on to the next, to minimise the impact on the overall path. Timescales are high level at the moment, they may extend/reduce a bit depending on what they find on site.

They will also be completing some minor surfacing works on the Main Street in Fauldhouse outside the train station around mid July, as well as some patching works on the A706, where the path will come out.

Stoneyburn side of work is progressing slowly but great to see the first half being completed.



Community Litter Pick

At our last community litter pick, our volunteers once again rose to the challenge and collected a whopping 32 bags of litter, along with wheel trims and traffic cones. Special recognition goes to Amy and Mica, who collected four bags from the roadside at Stoneheap Wood.

They also carried out a general tidy-up of the area. Healthy Minds Week

We hosted our Family Friday event on the 13th of March. It was the final event in our 'Healthy Minds Week'. The theme for our Family Friday this year was 'Equity and Inclusion at Our Lady's Primary School'. Our community partners set up stalls to let our families know what is available for them in the village. Many families were delighted to sign up to the free 'Play Along the Way' scheme which will enable families to drop their child off at the Play Bus in the village before school so they can have some fun and exercise before the school day begins.



Celtic Croft and Artistic Rhythms



Our Primary 1 to Primary 5 children have been working with the Limelight Music Company. The project they delivered to our Primary 1-3 children was entitled Celtic Croft. The project celebrates the creative culture, language, heritage and animals of Scotland. This project is an innovative experience for nursery to primary 4 pupils, exploring all the activities that take part within a crofters life, from working on the farmland to taking part in the social gathering, a Ceilidh. The Primary 4 and 5 children enjoyed the Artistic Rhythms Programme learning and creating music inspired by world artworks from 3 countries in 3 continents - Tanzania, Brazil and Scotland. These countries have been chosen for their rich cultural heritage, which often brings the art forms of dance, music, poetry, rhythm and visual art together. We were delighted to participate in this project developing our Expressive Arts knowledge and skills.

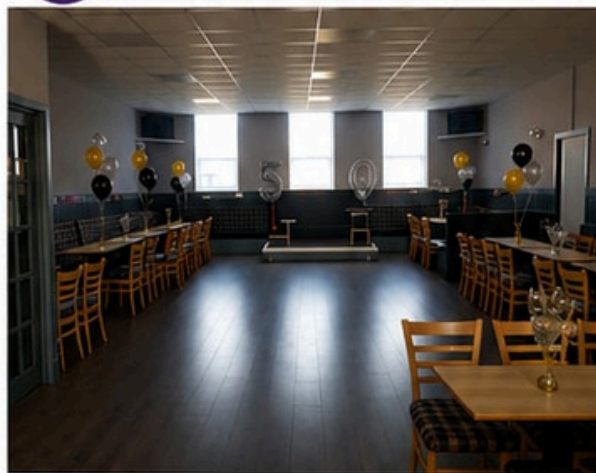

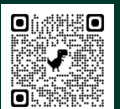
