# **The Mood Project**

MOOD continues to welcome anyone from West Lothian 18 years + who is feeling isolated, lonely, anxious or depressed to our wee hub next to Stoneyburn Juniors.

We have a number of prescriptive groups run on a Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday. These include: jewellery making, circuit projects, knitting, sewing machine projects, well-being garden, "Shed Your Worries" and arts and crafts.

MOOD staff also support people 1:1 in the community who are experiencing mental health issues. We work in partnership with local community health and social care services. We provide a bespoke support around your physical and mental health needs.

#### **Funding Updates**

We recently received funding from Tormywheel through Fauldhouse CDT. This will allow us to take our well-being garden forward.

We have been very fortunate to join the Capital City Partnership scheme. We received a load of pallets that will allow our upcycle/recycle projects to go ahead. From this Balfour Beaty (who donated the pallets) has continued to support us with any surplus materials for our outdoor projects as well as wood for our pyrography designs.

MOOD has joined with The Bridge community Project to deliver spend smart, eat well courses. Please see attached flyer for more information. We will also have a money advice worker on a weekly basis that can be accessed by anyone.

At the moment MOOD is one of the charities in Tesco's blue token scheme. This puts MOOD in the running to receive a donation. Please do vote for us while you are in Tesco.


#### AGM

## The Eco-museum of Scottish Mining

The Eco-museum of Scottish Mining Landscapes is Scotland's first industrial ecomuseum and the largest in the UK. Unlike traditional museums, it exists virtually across a defined geographical area, featuring walking and cycling routes enriched by community-created content such as maps, images, oral histories, and artworks. Funded by the National Heritage Lottery Fund, it highlights mining landscapes from Ayrshire to Fife.

Stoneyburn plays a key role in the museum, with the village featured as a destination. The Fulshie Bing Walk, its first intergenerational route, tells the story of Fulshie Colliery through landscape interpretation and includes a children's rock trail treasure hunt.
